GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS



3 Main Components:

- ★ Take & pass specific courses
- ★ Show Competency
- ★ Show Readiness

★ Take & Pass Specific Courses

Required Courses:

English: 4.0 credits

Mathematics: 4.0 credits *including Algebra II

Social Studies: 3.0 credits *including US History, Government, and World History

Science: 3.0 credits *biological science, physical science, advanced science

Fine Arts: 1.0 credit

Physical Education: 0.50 credit (or obtain the PE Waiver- *will be explained by Mr. Adams)

Health: 0.50 credit

Electives: 5.0 credits, must include Financial Literacy

★ Show Competency

Earn a passing score on the Ohio End of Course exams in Algebra 1 & English Language Arts II (passing score is determined by the Ohio Department of Education as a 684).

If students do not pass one or both exams, they must retake each at least once.

If testing is not a strength, three other options available include:

- 1. Demonstrate Two Career-Focused Activities (examples include a proficient score on the Webexams, a 12-point industry credential, a pre-apprenticeship or acceptance into an approved apprenticeship program)
- 2. Enlist in the Military
- 3. Complete College Coursework

\star Show Readiness

Earn two diploma seals, choosing those that line up with your goals and interests.

PE Waiver

- Students who participate in any OHSAA recognized sport OR Band/Drill Team for two (2) seasons will earn an exemption from their required Physical Education credit
- PE Waiver Forms are available in the counseling office and must be signed by the Athletic Director OR the Coach/Advisor of each activity
- Upon completion, PE Waivers should be returned to the student's counselor in the counseling office.

Eligibility

- In order to be eligible for sports & some activities, students must:
 - Pass 5 academic credit hours during the previous academic quarter
 - Earn a GPA of 2.0 or higher for the previous academic quarter.

- Academic Recovery Program
 - Available after consultation with Athletic
 Office for athletes passing 5 credits but
 falling below a 2.0 GPA
 - NOT available if not passing 5 credit hours
