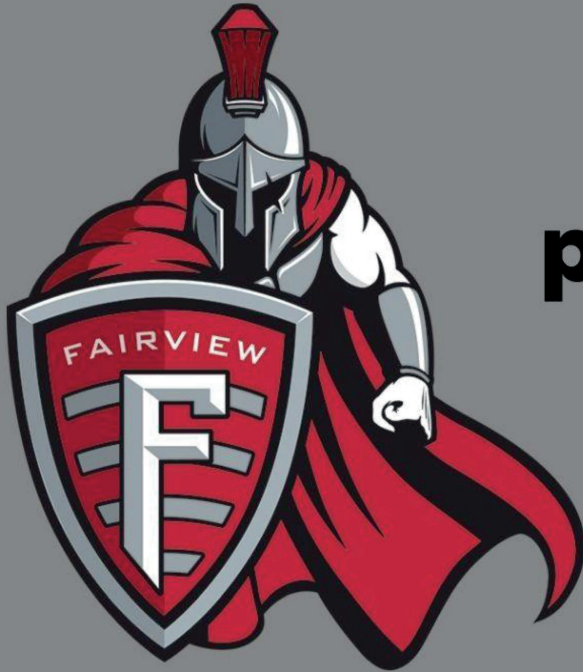

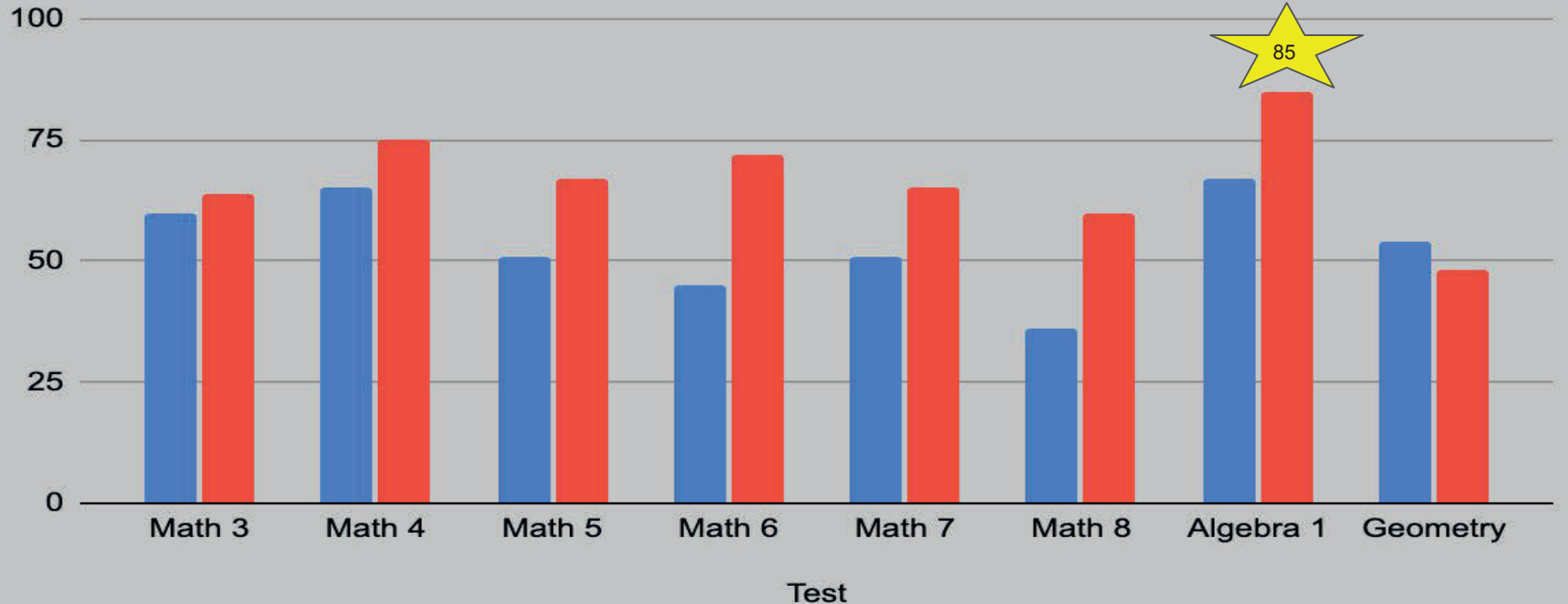
Preliminary Testing Results 2021-2022



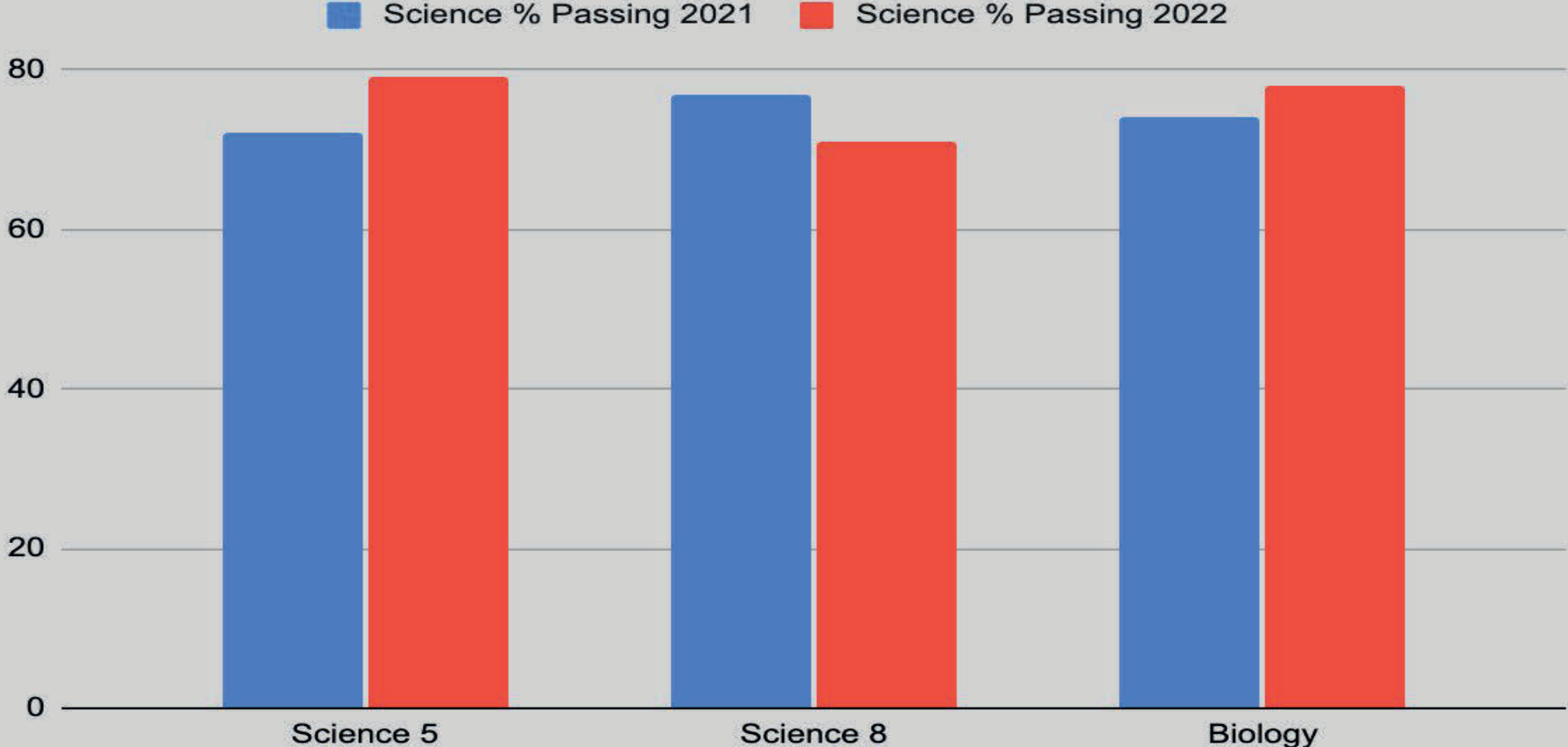
Preliminary Math Results 2022

Math % Passing 2021 and Math % Passing 2022

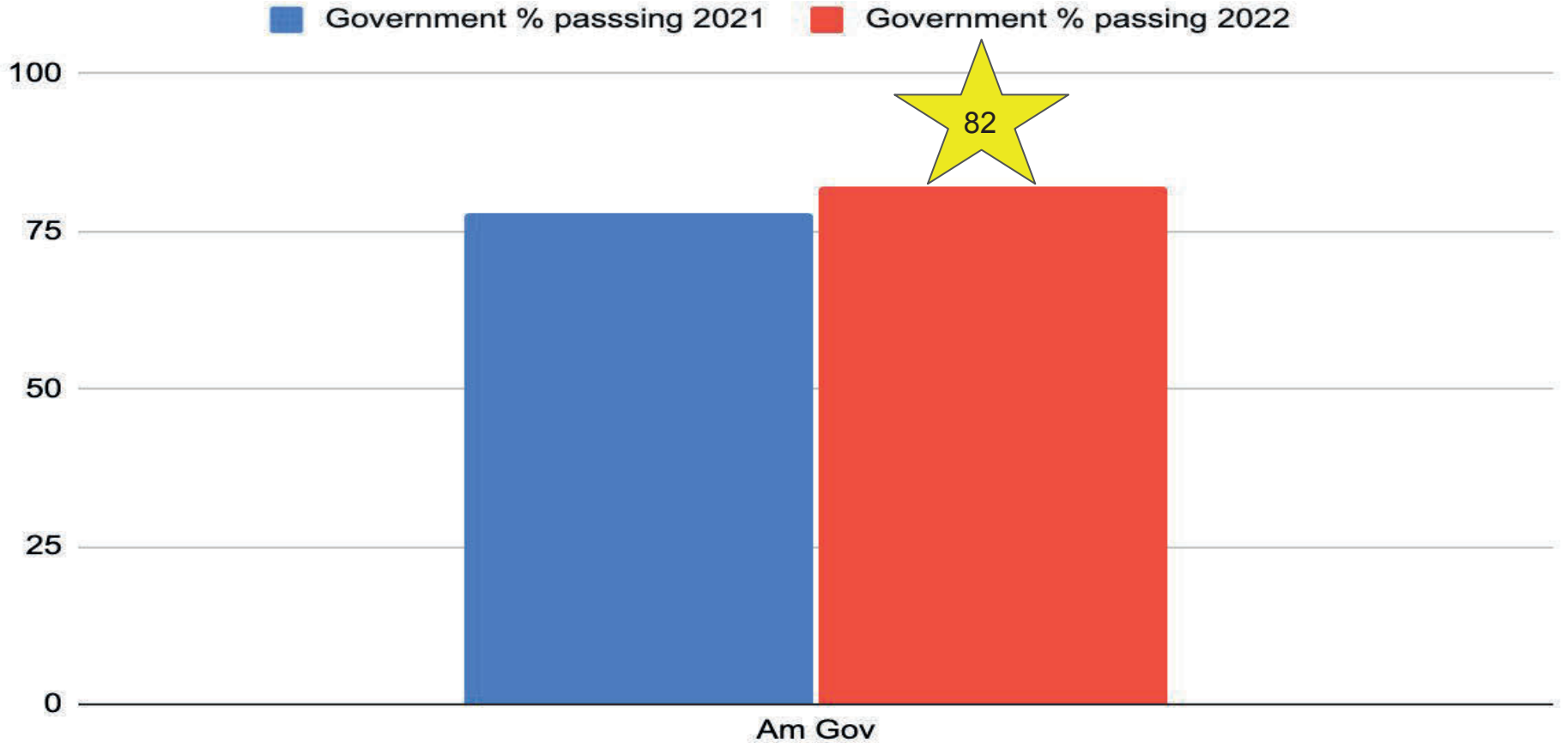
■ Math % Passing 2021 ■ Math % Passing 2022

Preliminary American Government Results 2022

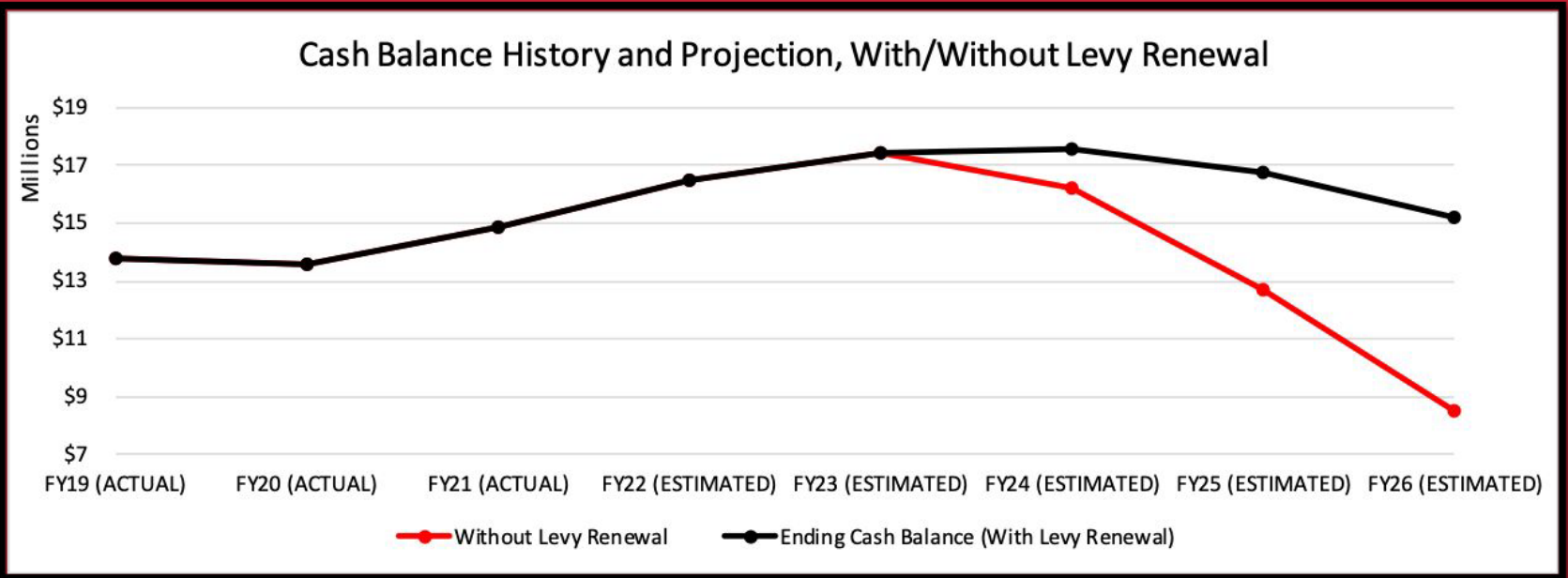


Upcoming Expiring Levy



Upcoming Expiring Levy:

- It is an Emergency Levy, worth \$2.69 million of revenue per year
- It was last renewed in November 2018 for 5 years, and will expire at the end of 2023
- Renewing this levy at some point during 2022 or 2023 will be critical to the financial stability of the district's operations.
- **Renewing this levy will NOT increase taxes.**

Operating (Emergency) Renewal Levy FAQ's

Why is our District considering going on the ballot in the upcoming election(s)?

- Renewal of emergency levy originally passed in 2003 and renewed every 5 years in 2008, 2013, & 2018. It needs to be renewed by 2023.

How much is this levy going to cost taxpayers?

- The Emergency Operating Levy is a renewal of the existing Emergency Operating Levy. This will generate the same dollar amount for the district and will not increase taxes.

Why is it called an “emergency” levy?

- This term is defined by the state as a property tax that serves as a limited operating levy proposed for a specific dollar amount. Although there is no emergency, this levy is critical to the district's continued operations.

How will the Emergency Operating Levy money be used?

- These funds will be used to maintain current programs by providing much needed operational funds for salaries, benefits, utilities, instructional materials/supplies, student academic programs, extra-curricular activities, etc.

My property values have recently increased. Will this increase the amounts I pay on the Renewal Emergency Operating Levy?

- **No.** Emergency Operating Levies, Substitute Emergency Operating Levies, Bond and Permanent Improvement levies are passed for a specific dollar amount. If property values increase, the Cuyahoga County Fiscal Officer is required by statute to reduce the millage to only collect the specific amount authorized by the voters.

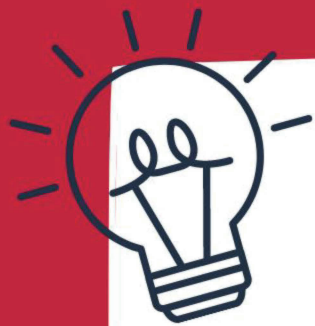
